Global Girl Leading Inspirational Film Project

In this week's Global Girl Leading workshop, we picked our most powerful 'SHEroes', who were our personal female heroes. We went through their most impacted moments and acknowledged the fact of how they helped younger and older women in the past, present and future. We brought in props to impersonate their personalities, and embraced how they were represented as an individual. One notable example discussed was Halle Berry, who made history as the first Black woman to win the Academy Award for Best Actress, an achievement that took 74 years to occur. Crafting our own award speeches provided valuable insights into the challenges women of colour face to gain recognition for their accomplishments, deepening our understanding of their ongoing struggle for equality and acknowledgment in various fields.

We discussed Da'Vine Joy Randolph, who received the Oscar for Best Supporting Actress in March 2024. In her speech, she spoke of her struggles as the only Black student in her class at school and how she realised she had to forge a pathway for herself.
