Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope this letter finds you well. A Friday update as always, as we come to the end of the first full week in school.

I am thrilled with how the first week back has gone; it has been a really impressive start for our school community. Attendance and Punctuality

Please note that new legislation has been introduced about attendance to schools:

- 10 absent sessions (5 days) that happen in 10 consecutive weeks can result in a Fixed Penalty Notice issued by Waltham Forest. This is includes arrival at school after 9.10am (without an acceptable reason) which is recorded as an unauthorised absence for the morning session (U code)
- This does not need to be from an unauthorised holiday/term time travel, it can be for unauthorised illness, or for days absent for no acceptable reason
- 1st Penalty Notice is £160 (per pupil in a family), if paid within 28 days, reducing to £80 if paid with 21 days
- 2nd Penalty Notice is £160 if paid within 28 days
- If your family have already had two Penalty Notices then the third may mean escalation to court

The school open evening is approaching. Students selected to be tour guides (Year 10) or subject helpers (any year) will be bringing home a letter with details. The event runs from 6pm to 9pm and headteacher talks will be held at 6pm and 7pm.

School visits already underway

As a school, we are reviewing schemes of work and visits and making sure we make the most of opportunities to take students out on visits that complement the curriculum. Urdu Lessons

We would like to offer Urdu lessons as part of our extracurricular language offer to students in **Year 9**. The Urdu lessons will sit outside of the normal academic day, on Mondays 3.30-4.30pm and on Fridays from 2.20pm-3.20pm. The lessons will be taught by a qualified Urdu teacher and there will be the option to undertake a GCSE in Urdu at the end of the course. There will be a cost to be part of the taught program as it is facilitated outside of school hours, but the school will subsidise some of the cost. If payment is an issue but you still wish your child to take part please let us know; however, as this is something that takes place outside of the main school curriculum we can only facilitate the sessions if enough students are paying to make it economically viable.

I would like to offer some advice for families on managing the difficult issue of smartphones with your children. I watched a Panorama programme on this topic (<u>LINK HERE</u>) with great interest and have had meaningful discussions with many families about it. There is increasing local interest in possibly banning smartphones for young people due to the harm they can cause, particularly in accessing harmful content online and on social media. Implementing such a policy at secondary school would be challenging. For now, parents should continue, as I have no doubt that you do, to closely monitor all their child's online activity. I have included (<u>HERE</u>) a link to the National Colleges free-to-download guide 'Using and reviewing parental controls' which you may find of use.
