Rewards

Year 10 remain in the lead with an impressive 6219 Achievement Points so far. Congratulations to Anjum (11F) who is helping Year 11 to catch up with the most Achievement Points awarded this week - 24!

We will soon be adding up all the Credits awarded to individual students and tutor groups in KS3 - the results will be revealed and rewarded in our end of term celebration assemblies.

Attendance

We have maintained our whole school attendance of over 95% this week with Year 9 being very close to our whole school target - their attendance is at 96.6%! Year 10 have significantly increased their attendance week; well done Year 10. 8F and 10F have had fantastic attendance last week with both achieving 98.6%.

Behaviour across the school

I was pleased to welcome an ex-headteacher and governor into the school this week for the third link governor visit this academic year. By inviting governors into school we can demonstrate to governors what is happening in school, have our critical friends report on progress and next steps, and it is an important opportunity for staff and students in school to see governors, and for governors to see them without the headteacher. Good behaviour in and around school is one of the highest priorities to me as Headteacher. Ensuring that students feel safe and happy and that teachers can teach their well-planned lessons is imperative. By sending your child to our school you are, of course, agreeing to support our policies and practices, including behaviour, attendance and punctuality. I would urge you periodically to talk through the behaviour processes, to ensure that your child is fully aware of our expectations and, critically, that you support us. We will be doing work in pastoral time with the students next week looking at reminders on the behaviour policy again, and level 1, level 2, level 3 and level 4 behaviours; the differences and the escalation in sanctions between them. As ever, I am very grateful for your ongoing support.

Monty, Therapy dog session 1

'Monty the therapy dog was in school on Wednesday and we had a series of sessions with students over the course of the day and then some sessions with students at lunchtime for a 'club' where the group of students could even take the dog for a short walk. The sessions we have offered have been massively oversubscribed so an enormous 'thank you' to parents for getting the forms and reply slips back for all the students that have

shown an interest in the sessions. The feedback forms from the session on Wednesday are all incredibly positive and show a significant positive impact from the very first session. Our learning mentor Ms Massella has been instrumental in supporting this initiative and helping identify students and supporting students with the sessions. In addition to this, we are so grateful to Gavin and the dog 'Monty' for committing time out of a hectic schedule (helping others) to come in and help us with this trial. Session 2 is on Tuesday next week. Sustainability and recycling in school

Over the past 10 months, the school has been looking at how we can improve our sustainability, how much we cycle and reduce our carbon footprint. We had considerable investment in 2019 for upgrading the heating systems in the school to make them more efficient, and changed our contract with our waste disposal to upgrade the number of recycling bins and reduce the amount of non-recyclable waste we produce. This term we introduced specific food waste recycling bins in the dining room. These bins are collected and turned into biofuel to make the waste from lunchtime into another product. Even the bin lorry is run from biofuel! Encouraging students to look after their environment and to think about a more sustainable future is part of their personal development, geography and science education.

Archery

Due to anticipated high demand, we will be starting a rolling programme of archery classes. The sessions will initially be the *"have a go"* sessions from Archery GB. The sessions will be on a Friday from 2.20-4.00pm and we will do a series of these so all students that are interested can try this out. Once we have a list of students interested we will allocate a week for them to attend a trial session. Normally the sessions are £18.50 each' but the school will subsidise the cost of all the *"have a go"* sessions so that they are freely available for every student who wishes to do it. Once we have finished the list of students wanting to take the taster archery classes, there is a series of beginner courses



which are 10 hours (taught over six weeks). We will send out more information on this at a later date. These sessions are beginner classes and the course will work on different techniques to develop the students into competent archers. At the end of the course, students will receive Archery GB certificates.
