Public Speaking - Model United Nations Conferences

Huge congratulations to **Umavi Pagoda**, 11F on winning another prestigious award for her research and oratory skills when delivering her paper to the Model United Nations Conference. This is what Umavi had to say:

I had an incredible opportunity to represent the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland at an International United Nations (MUN) conference which was organised by the Cambridge University UK, where selected delegates came from different continents to debate and collaborate on global issues. As a delegate for the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), I was tasked with researching and presenting solutions to complex global challenges. Regarding this, I had to conduct extensive research to develop my research and prepare documents outlining the political stance of the UK, which had to align with the common goals and priorities of the UNHCR. The conference was conducted for 03 days which equalled 21 hours in total. It was a great honor to listen and debate with other delegates who shared a passion for international cooperation and diplomacy representing their relevant countries. I am truly humbled and grateful to have been recognised with the award for the "Best Position Paper" by the Chairs of the committee. However, this would not have been possible without the guidance and belief that Connaught School instils in its students.

Accompaniments to Perfection


