

MSF Non uniform

Well done to the CSFG student Voice this term. They have been proactive in organising the charities to support over the academic year and have started by developing their own understanding of Medecin Sans Frontiere (MSF). A year 10 student describes this better:

A non-school uniform day was recently held at our school to raise money for Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF), a global organisation that offers vital medical assistance in places impacted by natural disasters, disease outbreaks, and conflict. The concept was straightforward: in exchange for a pound to assist MSF's essential work, staff and students could wear something other than their uniforms for the day. The fact that MSF is an international charity that many people in our school, including myself, were previously unaware of was what made the day really memorable.

Everyone gathered to the event wearing their own clothes, ranging from casual clothing to vibrant pieces, creating a sense of excitement. In addition to raising funds, the week generated discussions about the difficulties faced by those in disaster areas and how charities like MSF offer hope in tragic circumstances.

To help us learn more, we were privileged to have a speaker from MSF share inspiring stories about their mission. All form groups saw a brief, captivating presentation that introduced students to the vital job that MSF performs, including reacting to disease outbreaks, helping communities after natural disasters, and providing emergency medical care. The cause seemed more immediate after hearing the speaker's first-hand stories. Many students left with a fresh understanding of the difficulties encountered by people in need and MSF's work. Year 11 Borough Market Visit


