Dear Parents/Carers.

I hope this letter finds you well, I have a Friday update as always. It was lovely to see our Year 11 parents in school last week to talk through how well the students have been learning and the progress they have made. As ever, you will have heard of our ambitions for your children and I can reassure you that the drive for high standards in teaching and learning continues to be a priority area for us.

You may be aware that unfortunately I have been informed by the NEU representative that there is a possibility of further ballot for strike action this term. The school leadership and the governors have been meeting with the NEU representative and offered to meet with members to discuss concerns and continue to work with them in good faith to avoid further disruption. However, we will always continue to ask for teaching that serves the children and fulfils the potential they all show. I hope the parents' evening and talking to the teachers directly was a chance for you to also see this and find out how your children are being challenged and supported.

This week I had the privilege to join two geography classes out on their field work visit to look at sustainable developments. I can say that their conduct was exemplary and I was very proud of their diligent approach to their studies- more on this below.

History visit to Ypres

We wish our history students well as they embark on the first residential visit for the school in several years. They left this morning with Mr Klemenic, Ms Hickes, Ms El Khandari, and Mr Desborough at 5:30am- a very early start for them! We sent them off expecting them to have a great time and I will update you more on their progress next week. It shows how far we have come in a short time to have such an increase in the number of visits across the school and I am incredibly thankful to these staff for committing their time to go on this residential visit.

Year 10 stay in the lead overall this term, with 1244 Achievement Points. Well done to you all. Salma (11F) is back in the lead individually this week with 37 APs!

Attendance

7S have taken the top spot for attendance so far this year - they are currently at 97.7% Close run for 2 - 5th places, with only 0.1% in it!

Year 9 keep their overall lead with 95.81% attendance this year though year 7 are snapping at their heels with 95.76%.

Geography field trip

This week the Year 11 GCSE students ventured to Hackney Wick and East Village for a field trip focused on the Eduqas B specification. Despite the heavy rain on Tuesday, the students remained upbeat and engaged, working effectively throughout the day. Their enthusiasm and teamwork were impressive, and the trip provided valuable insights for their fieldwork in Paper 3. The following trip on Thursday saw much better weather, with all the students continuing to work diligently. Both outings not only reinforced their knowledge in Theme 1 but also helped deepen their understanding of urban regeneration and the impacts of the 2012 Olympic legacy to the area.
